Be more responsive

The strategies of Nicole and Anne will be put to some use in the future when I evaluate students' written assignments.

Adding more writing assignments to the curriculum requirements, (With assigned grading points)

I am more aware of how my comments may be perceived by the students. It is better to list areas of improvements and specific helpful points instead of using blanket words or comments as to why the work did not meet the expectation.

I will listen more and acknowledge the needs of the students.

Communicate more precisely in class and assignments. Also, assign more writing assignments.

I have never been exposed to the concept of effective teaching for ESL students. This exposure was truly helpful in enhancing my sensitivity to the subject.

Most of my courses do not involve much writing but they do involve detailed communication, often with several ESL students. This workshop has provided me with many suggestions and alternatives to my methods for keeping students actively engaged.

Every semester I try to incorporate more and more writing into my art/fashion projects.

I think I will make myself more available in terms of conferences with students.

This will definitely help me give students better feedback on their writing in my classes! The summary at the end was very helpful and can be directly applied to my present modes of interaction.

I will touch base with each of my students to see if they understand what is expected of them and to answer any of their questions.

It helps me more aware of the challenges ESL students face, and gave me some good suggestions on how to work with ESL students.

I am rethinking my approach in presenting info and reviewing/grading student assignments.

Honestly, I can't imagine I'll be able to use much of this. Ann was interesting and dynamic. Nicole needs to work on her presentation style. This was disappointing. So much of what we covered was not much about second language speakers but instead about students who lack a good command of written English, either native speakers or not. I was hoping for more of this thing and there was none.

I will be more compassionate with international students and more realistic with my expectations. Thank you.

I feel that this was slightly geared toward only English writing assignments. Much is not applicable to other courses which i also teach at FIT.

The lengthy discussion of the instructors and various drafts of the pre-lunch exercise was not relevant to my teaching at FIT. I teach technical subjects, not English grammar and prose. There is no nearly enough time in our curriculum to go into all this level of work for 1 short essay - NOT PRACTICAL! Irrelevant to most of our adjunct teaching. Far too much emphasis on the students writing in English; far too little attention to strategies instructors can use to better/best convey content/information to students whom English is not their first language. Anne Pomerantz' insight was useful and relevant; Nicole Houser's exercise and commentary was not as relevant to my teaching at FIT.

Some of the suggestions were/are too time consuming to implement in assignments.

The last group breakout could have been much stronger as a project specially as the day is coming to a close (make the conclusion more interesting)

This event was very helpful in bringing to my attention the difficulties that our ESL students face.
