Glossary

Description of Dataset: The dataset used for Fact Book enrollment reporting matched the "home institution" students reported in the SUNY SIRIS system. Hence, the dataset is the total number of students enrolled in credit-bearing courses as of the Fall 2025 term census date. Senior Learners who are auditing credit courses, students enrolled in FIT degree programs at SUNY Korea, graduate students in maintenance of matriculation, and International Exchange students (major code 7777) are omitted.

Age

Age is calculated as of the first day of the term, using the full date for both the student's birth date and the first day of the term.

Citizenship Status

Whether a student is a domestic resident of the United States (including US citizens, permanent residents, and undocumented individuals) or an international/non-resident who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa (F-type, J-type, or another visa type) or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Note: "International student" aligns with the IPEDS definition for "U.S. Nonresident" and is therefore reported separately rather than in any of the racial/ethnic categories.

Disability Status

Whether a student has self-identified with the FITABLE Office Of Disability Services as having one or more disabilities. Disability categories include Neurodevelopmental, Sensory, Mental Health, Physical, Intersystem, or Temporary.

EOP Status

Whether a student is or was formerly active in the State University of New York's Arthur O. Eve Educational Opportunity Program. EOP offers financial and support services to eligible New York State residents who qualify as economically disadvantaged.

Excelsior Status

Whether a student received an Excelsior scholarship. The New York State Excelsior Scholarship covers any remaining gap in tuition expenses after other federal and state grants and scholarships are applied up to a limit for eligible New York State residents attending public colleges and universities in the state.

First-Generation Status

Whether or not a student is first-generation, according to the parental education levels identified on their application to FIT. A first-generation individual is someone whose parents, or parent, did not attain a baccalaureate degree.

Gender

Whether a student/employee is Male, Female, or another recognized category according to the Legal Sex field in Banner, which is comprised of either M, F, or X. The category X is inclusive of, but not limited to, gender-sex categories such as non-binary, intersex, genderfluid, and genderqueer.

Housing Status

Whether the student is an On-Campus Resident (living in one of FIT's four residence halls) or an Off-Campus/Commuter student (not living in a FIT residence hall).

International Exchange Student Status

Whether a student is a nondegree nonresident participating in a bilateral program from an institution outside the U.S. and is enrolled in FIT courses for one or two semesters. These students are coded with a 7777 major code in BANNER. All exchange students are regarded as "non-home institution" students; therefore, they are excluded in official FIT headcount reporting.

Legal Nation

A student's legal nation registered on their active student visa to study in the United States for the term.

Military Status

Whether the student is on active duty (currently serving in the US Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, or the Space Force), is a dependent or spouse of active-duty personnel, or a veteran (served but is not on active duty).

Pell Status

Whether a student was awarded a Federal Pell Grant. Pell grants are awarded to U.S. citizens who are undergraduate students who meet financial need requirements and are enrolled or accepted into eligible degree programs.

Permanent Residence Address

A student's permanent address indicates their primary residence, which may differ from the local address where they reside while attending school. For dependent students, the permanent address is often their parent's or guardian's. For tuition purposes, the student's residency status may differ from their permanent residence as indicated in the Tuition Rate.

Race/Ethnicity Reporting

Race/Ethnicity categories are based on reporting rules adopted by the federal Bureau of Budget and Management in 1997, which are currently used by the National Center for Education Statistics in IPEDS reporting and SUNY reporting. Information on national origin, Hispanic origin, and race is collected from students. Students who are not citizens or U.S. nationals are reported as international, regardless of how they respond to the race/ethnicity question.

Hispanic

An individual having Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origins.

American Indian or Alaska Native

A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) who maintains cultural identification through tribal affiliation or community recognition.

Asian

A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian Subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Black or African-American

A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander

A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

White

An individual having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe.

International (F1 or Other Visa Holder)

A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely. Note: "International student" aligns with the IPEDS definition for "U.S. Nonresident" and is therefore reported separately rather than in any of the racial/ethnic categories.

Middle Eastern

An individual having origins of Middle East or North Africa.

Multi-racial

A person who indicates belonging to more than one race category.

Not Reported

The category used to report students whose race and ethnicity are unknown.

School

Within FIT, one of four schools that grants degrees: The School of Art and Design, the Jay and Patty Baker School of Business and Technology, the School of Liberal Arts and Sciences, and the School of Graduate Studies. A Dean leads each School.

TAP Status

Whether a student was awarded a grant through the New York State Tuition Assistance Program (TAP). TAP offers a grant to legal residents of New York State attending approved schools who maintain at least a C average as of the 4th semester and meet income eligibility requirements.

Tuition Rate

The tuition rate the student paid during the term, in-state or out-of-state. Students residing in New York City are reported separately from the rest of New York State resident students, but both groups pay the same in-state rate.

Visiting Student Status

Whether a student enrolled at another institution is nominated by their primary institution to study at FIT. These students may be domestic or international individuals pursuing a one-year AAS degree or seeking nondegree study for one or two semesters. Students pursuing the AAS degree are assigned the appropriate major code for their specific program, while those nondegree students are coded with the 7776 major code in BANNER. All visiting students are regarded as "home institution" students; therefore, they are included in official FIT headcount reporting.
